

A Burial Service for an Unknown Soldier of The South Wales Borderers

Killed during the Great War

10:00 hours Wednesday 19 June 2019 Béthune Town Cemetery, France

Service conducted by The Rev'd Ben Archibald CF Chaplain to 1st Battalion The Royal Welsh The remains of this South Wales Borderer were discovered on the outskirts of Richebourg during drainage work in 2016. Research suggests that this soldier was most likely a member of 1st Battalion The South Wales Borderers who was killed on 9 or 10 May 1915 during the Battle of Aubers Ridge. However, there are unfortunately still too many soldiers of that battalion missing from that time to be able to identify this man. He will, therefore, be buried today as an unknown soldier of The South Wales Borderers.

Les restes de ce soldat de South Wales Borderers ont été découverts à l'orée de Richebourg au cours des les travaux de drainage en 1916. Il est probablement qu'il été un soldat du 1º Bataillon South Wales Borderers et qu'il a été tué le 9 ou 10 mai 1915 au cours de La Bataille de la Crête d'Aubers. Malheureusement il manque toujours un trop grand nombre de soldats de South Wales Borderers disparus pendant cette bataille pour pouvoir tenter d'identifier cet individu. Il sera donc inhumé aujourd'hui comme un soldat inconnu du South Wales Borderers.

The town of Béthune acted as an important railway and hospital hub for much of the war. As such, designated plots within the local cemetery were used for the burial of over 3,000 casualties who had died as a result of their wounds or were killed in the surrounding area. These plots make up the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Béthune Town Cemetery. The unidentified casualty can now be laid to rest alongside 27 of his comrades from The South Wales Borderers.
