

A Burial Service for An Unknown Soldier of The Connaught Rangers and An Unknown Soldier of an Unknown Regiment Killed during the Great War

11:00 hours Wednesday 20 March 2019 Guillemont Road Cemetery, France

Service conducted by the Reverend Nathan King CF Chaplain 1st Battalion The Royal Irish Regiment The remains of this unknown soldier of The Connaught Rangers and this unknown soldier of an unknown regiment were discovered on the outskirts of Guillemont during work on a wind turbine project. Research suggests this Connaught Ranger was most likely a member of 6th Battalion who attacked the village during the Battle of Guillemont in September 1916. Unfortunately, there are still too many Connaught Rangers missing in this area from the battle to identify this man. No artefacts were found with the other casualty to suggest which regiment he belonged to. They will therefore be buried today as an unknown soldier of The Connaught Rangers and an unknown soldier of an unknown regiment.

Les restes de ce soldat des Connaught Rangers et ce soldat inconnu d'un régiment inconnu ont été découverts à l'orée de Guillemont au cours des travaux pour un projet d'éoliennes. Les recherches indiquent que ce soldat des Connaught Rangers est plus probablement un soldat du 6e Bataillon qui ont attaqué le village en septembre 1916 durant la Bataille de Guillemont. Malheureusement il manque toujours un trop grand nombre de soldats des Connaught Rangers disparus pendant cette bataille pour pouvoir tenter d'identifier cet individu. Il n'y avait pas des artefacts trouve avec l'autre soldat qui pourrait indiquer son régiment. Ils seront donc inhumé comme un soldat inconnu des Connaught Rangers et un soldat inconnu d'un régiment inconnu.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Guillemont Road Cemetery was created by fighting units in September 1916, after the Battle of Guillemont, and was in operation until March 1917. After the armistice, the size of the cemetery increased with the concentration of graves from the surrounding battlefields, including the town of Ginchy. It is from this area that these two casualties, one of whom served with the Connaught Rangers, were discovered. They can now be laid to rest alongside their comrades.
