Woburn Abbey Cemetery

The Commonwealth Was Graves Commission's Woburn Abbey Cemetery was named from a house on the East side of used as Battalion Headquarters and as a Dressing Station. It was beguin in June 1915 and closed in Juneary 1916, although a small number of further burisle were made as late as April 1918, Polts III were added after the Ammistice by the concentration of graves from the battlefields East of Bethune and from a number of smaller cometeries. Sadly, almost half of those buried in this cemetery, including the two casualties being intered today, reman unidentified.
