Underneath the centre wire is an earth wire 6" from it - ASKEW was endeavouring to push a piece of string along the earth wire and asked me for a rod. I handed him one and cautioned him to be careful of the wires, the danger of which were known to all working in the room. I looked away and on looking up again saw that he was about to descent. Then I saw a succession of small flashes followed by a large flash. His body stiffened out and fell flat on the ground a distance of about 8 feet, sustaining severe injuries to the head which bled freely. Both hands and forearms were badly burned.



He sustained injuries to his head and his right hand and forearm were burnt. He was carried at once to a box car for evacuation to an Ambulance. I then went at once and reported the occurrence to Capt. Burden.
