

INSTRUCTIONS.

- (1) Application forms received by Recruiting Officers will not be handed back again to applicants, but will be passed direct to the Medical Practitioner, who will similarly return them to the Recruiting Officer, who will then forward them by post to the Officer in Charge of the Central Recruiting Depot to which recruits are instructed by them to report.
- (2) If an Applicant who has been rejected desires a copy of this certificate, it must be completed in duplicate at the time of Medical Examination, and the word "original" or "duplicate," as the case may be, will appear on top of the respective forms. Both copies will be forwarded to the Officer in Charge of the Central Recruiting Depot, where the duplicate will be impressed with the official stamp and then returned to the Applicant.
- (3) Copies will NOT be made of any certificates of acceptance. The word "Duplicate" will be struck out of such certificates, and they will be sent to the Officer in Charge of the Central Recruiting Depot by post.
- (4) Names of accepted applicants who do not report at Central Recruiting Depot within the prescribed time will be forwarded to the local Recruiting Officer for information.
- (5) When alternatives are shown on the front of the form such as:— Fit Ward Widower Single Original Duplicate strike out the words which are not applicable.
- (6) Only those persons who fulfil the requirements in all other respects will be examined regarding medical fitness. These requirements may be ascertained by reference to daily newspapers and official posters.
- (7) The Central Recruiting Depot to which accepted applicants from various places will be sent for final medical examination will be determined by District Commandants. Recruiting Officers at outlying places will require to issue clear instructions to such applicants informing them where and when to report, and will forward the application forms in time to ensure that they will be in the hands of the Officer in Charge of the Central Recruiting Depot when the recruit reports for enlistment.





lst. Witness. No. 154. L/C. William Frederick Holmes, "A" Coy. 23rd. Battalion states:-

At about 11.10 a.m. on the 5th. July 1918, I was in charge of a squad of "A" Coy practising musketry. Two men of the squad had fired 15 dummy rounds at the eye disc which I was holding. Pte. Turner was the first man to be tested. Before testing him I demonstrated with my own rifle which I had loaded with five rounds taken from one of the men who had already been tested and was refilling the clips. The first two shots I snapped were dummies, the third being a live round. Pte. Turner had picked up the eye disc and was looking through it observing my aim. The dummy ammunition in use was the ordinary wooden tipped coloured red. I did not notice any live ammunition in the clip when I loaded the rifle. Under instructions we had been using live ammunition for rapid loading practice prior to the "smoko" spell. The men were all carrying live ammunition in their pouches during the dummy practice, this was carried in the left side pouches the right side heing emptied and stacked behind the squad to enable the pouches to be used for the practice.

Three rounds of live ammunition which I had used to lock the trigger during practice of rapid loading with ball ammunition were lying on my right and I am quite sure I did not pick any of them up. The clips of dummies when loaded were placed on my left and to the front of me. During the demonstration by the Corpl. Turner was sighting through the eye disc. The shot from the rifle entered his head at the eye at the completion of the rapid loading practice with live ammunition, the Cpl. gave us instructions to pick up and put away all live ammunition.

This practice is carried out with absolute safety for rapid loading only. During rapid aiming practice dummy ammunition only is used and all live ammunition should be taken away.

Turner lying on the ground with blood flowing from his head. I immediately sent for Doctor and stretcher bearers and picked up the rifle from which the shot had been fired (which I now produce). This rifle had an empty cartridge case in the chamber and two dummy cartridges in the magazine. I also picked up a clip and two dummy cartridges on the right of where L/C. Holmes had been lying w hilst demonstrating, and one dummy cartridge on the right and close to Pte. Turner. There were only three clips of dummy ammunition with the squad and the other two were full. The two dummy cartridges beside L/C. Holmes were in such a position as if they had been ejected from his rifle but there was nothing to account for the position of the dummy cartridge beside Pte. Turner.

SUPPLEMENTARY EVIDENCE.

The Court having been reconstituted proceed to take further evidence: --

No. 154. L/C. William Frederick Holmes states:-

The evidence which I previously gave and in which I stated that the men were all carrying live ammunition in their pouches during the dummy practice and that this ammunition was carried in the left side pouches right side being clear is not correct. The ammunition was taken out of all pouches and placed in rear of the squad.

I made an inspection of the rifles and equipment of all the men of my squad with the object of accertaining that they had no live ammunition on their persons during rapid practice. The only reason that I can put forward for having given incorrect evidence at the last sitting of the Court is that I was very much affected, as the result of the accident and was by no means well.

No. 6838. Pte. Len Lazarus states:-

My previous evidence regarding the removal of ammunition from only the right pouches referred to period of Rapid Loading practice when all ammunition was removed with the exception of 15 rounds. During the rapid aim practice all pouches were clear of ammunition. Our pouches and rifles were inspected by Cpl. Holmes prior to rapid aim practice.

FINDING.

he Court having considered the evidence finds that the death of No. 6899. Pte. J. Turner was accidentally caused by a shot fired from a rifle by L/C. Holmes during musketry practice on the morning of the 5th. inst. The Court considers that more supervision should have been exercised by L/C. Holmes in seeing that only dummy cartridges were loaded into the clips for aiming practice before carrying out the practice.


