

A Burial Service for An Unknown Soldier of an Unknown Regiment Killed during the Great War

14:30 hours Tuesday 16 April 2019 Guards' Cemetery, Lesboeufs, France

Service conducted by the Reverend Tim Flowers CF Chaplain 4th Battalion The Mercian Regiment The remains of this unknown soldier were discovered on the outskirts of Ginchy during work on a wind turbine project. No artefacts were found with this soldier to suggest which regiment he belonged to. It is likely that he was killed in September 1916 when heavy fighting took place in this area. He will be buried today as an unknown soldier of the Great War.

Les restes de ce soldat inconnu d'un régiment inconnu ont été découverts à l'orée de Ginchy au cours des travaux pour un projet d'éoliennes. Il n'y avait pas des artefacts trouve avec ce soldat qui pourrait indiquer son régiment. Il est probablement qu'il a été tué en septembre 1916 quand des combats violents eurent lieu dans cette région. Il sera inhumé aujourd'hui comme un soldat inconnu de la Grande Guerre.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission Guards' Cemetery, Lesboeufs, was created after the capture of Lesboeufs in September 1916. Originally consisting of 40 graves, the cemetery increased after the Armistice with the concentration of isolated graves and small cemeteries from the surrounding battlefields. Sadly, over half of the burials within this cemetery, including the casualty being interred today, remain unidentified.
