

A Burial Service for

An Unknown Soldier of The Essex Regiment And An Unknown Soldier of the Great War

14:30 hours Tuesday 5 November 2019

New Irish Farm Cemetery, Belgium

Service conducted by the Reverend Paul Whitehead CF Chaplain to 3rd Battalion The Royal Anglian Regiment Between 2014 and 2015 twenty four sets of remains were found during construction work, at what is believed to have been the site of Irish Farm Cemetery. It had previously been thought that after the Great War the graves in Irish Farm Cemetery had all been moved to New Irish Farm Cemetery, a short distance away. Twenty one of these soldiers have already been buried with full military honours in this cemetery.

One of the remaining five soldiers was found with shoulder titles of The Essex Regiment. Research showed that this casualty was most likely a member of 2nd Battalion The Essex Regiment who was killed between May and September 1915. There are still too many soldiers of The Essex Regiment missing from this period to identify this soldier. He will be buried today alongside an unknown soldier of an unknown regiment who was found with him and we will remember their sacrifice.

Close to a location known by the troops as 'Irish Farm', the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's New Irish Farm Cemetery was first used in August 1917 and by the war's end contained 73 burials. After the Armistice, the cemetery was greatly increased in size when more than 4,500 graves were concentrated from several small cemeteries and the surrounding battlefields near Ypres. It is from this area that these two unknown casualties were recovered and can now be laid to rest alongside their comrades.

Call to Worship

We have gathered here today to remember two unknown soldiers who were caught up in the courageous but tragic events of the First World War and who received commendation and award for their courage, loyalty and determination in the face of impossible odds. We remember those who were killed in action, or by disease, the bereaved, the lost, the families which were shattered, the wounded, maimed and injured, those who held in silence unspeakable memories of warfare.

Bidding Prayer

Eternal God, from whom all thoughts of truth and peace proceed:

Kindle, we pray, in the hearts of all, the true love of peace and guide with your pure and peaceable wisdom those who take counsel for the nations of the earth that in tranquillity your kingdom may go forward, till the earth is filled with the knowledge of your love; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
