

Rededication Service for Second Lleutenant David Belli 13th (Scottish Horse) Bn. Black Watch (Royal Highlanders) Killed in Action 7 October 1918 CWGC Prospect Hill Cemetery, Gouy, France 10.15 hrs. Tuesdaw 22 March 2022

David Bell was born in 1888 in Dalry, Ayrshire, son of George Bell and Agnes Armour. He had one brother, Robert and 5 sisters (Mary-Ann, Agnes, Jane, Elizabeth and Ellen). A brief history of the 13th Scottish Horse Battalion, Black Watch (Royal Highlanders)



They were formed in Abbassia in Egypt on 1 October 1916 from three dismounted Yeomany Regiments; the 1st and 2st Scotlish Horse and details from the 3st. They moved to Sallonika, arriving 21 October 1916, coming under command of the 81st Brigade in the 27st Division. In June 1918 they moved to France and on 15 July 1918 they transferred to 149st Brigade in the 50st (Northumbrian) Division.

The Cemetery

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Prospect Hill Commitery was made in October 1918 and increased after the Armistice when graves were brought in from the surrounding lattifiedist, among them that of Second Lieutenant David Bell. of the S58 graves and commenorations at the site, 115 are unidentified. Alongside these casualties lies a single named Commonwealth airman of the Second World War.
