He was attached to A.Coy and had been at Bettalion Hetres at Resthock. He came up with males and rations and they were unloading when Frits spetted them and sent ever a selver. Capt Moule was wounded in the legs. He was taken the the dressing-station and then to hospital where he died. I was on the phone when the message came through to say that he had had to undergo an operation for the amputation of his leg and that he died almost directly afterwards. I was a signaller at the time and at Headquarters.

I knew Captein Loule for 18 months; he was over medium height, slight, very dark, about 36, a very good sport, oricket particularly, and came from South Australia. On the 19th Octr the Battn was at Essechendeels and we were holding the line. Captain Moule, who was Battn Q.M., came up with mules and was unloading. A shell fell near and Captain Moule was wounded in unloading. A shell fell near and Captain Louis was wounded in the leg. He was taken to the A.F. and from there to the C.C.S. where the leg had to be amputated. I was told by an eyewitness, whose name I don't remember. I was on the phone at Battn H.C. about a wook after an a message came through to say daptain Houle had died. I am not certain but I think this C.C.S. Was near Bailled where there was a Military Cemetery:

I saw him wounded at Zomebeke whilst superintending the unloading of some rations. He was caught by a piece of shell which hit him about the knee. I dressed his wounds for him and he was sent away to the Dressing Station, and seemed very cheerful. He was a very ? Officer and was very well liked by all the men. Have not any details of death and burial and I cannot refer to anyone.
