8/3504 Sgt Donald Worcester Brown (late) Inf Btch A3 E.F. - For most conspicuous bravery & determination in attack when the Coy to which he belonged suffered very heavy casualties in Officers & men from machine gun fire. At great personal risk this N.C.O. advanced with a comrade & succeeded in reaching a point within 30 yards of the enemy guns. Four of the gun crew were killed & the gun captured. The advance of the Coy was continued till it was again held up by machine gun fire.

Again Sgt Brown & his comrade with great gallantry pushed the gun & killed the crew. After this second position had been won, the Coy came under very heavy shell fire, & the utter contempt for danger coolness under fire of this N.C.O. did much to keep up the spirit of his men. On a subsequent occasion in attack, Sgt Brown showed most conspicuous gallantry. He attacked singlehanded a machine gun which was holding up the attack, killed the gun crew & recaptured the gun. Later whilst sniping the retreating enemy, this very gallant soldier was killed.

8/3504 Donald ~~Foster~~ Brown was born at Dunedin, New Zealand, on 23 February 1890. He enlisted for service on 19 October 1915 and embarked for Egypt with 9th Reinforcements on 8 January 1916.

On arrival in Egypt in March he was posted to 2nd Battalion, Otago Infantry Regiment, and promoted Sergeant prior to embarking for France in April.

He began active service at Armentieres, France, and his unit was engaged in the Battle of the Somme when he was awarded the Victoria Cross for gallantry in action at High Wood on 15 September 1916. Following a further act of gallantry at Baucourt l'Abbaye on 1 October 1916, details of which are included in his VC citation, Sgt Brown was killed in action.

Prior to enlistment Sgt Brown was a farmer on his own account in the Totara district near Oamaru. He was unmarried and his Victoria Cross was presented to his father, Mr Robert Brown, at Oamaru, by the Earl of Liverpool, Governor General, on 30 August 1917. His other medals were sent to his brothers, R. Brown and C.C. Brown, Oamaru, who were executors of his estate.
