I knew a man called Lacey in B.VIII, and his number was about 3815. I don't know his initials but he was the only Lacey in B.C. He told he used to drive a lorry in Richmond Victoria before the war. He was well built, about 5ft 8, clean shaven, dark and about 25. I don't know if he was married. I heard his name read out as missing after the action of the 26th Sept at Polygon Wood. I last saw him about a week ago with the battn which is resting at Devres and he was quite well then.

H. Sept 25-26th 1917.

I was A.Co clerk at Patricia Camp near Abelle (?)  
I well remember the paybook and wallet of Lacey being handed  
in by a man in A.Co whose name I do not know. The effects  
were sent on to Battn orderly room. I remember I wrote  
a letter of sympathy signed by Lieut Haughton acting Company  
officer, to his brother who was in England. I remember  
this incident well and also remember that the Battn posted  
him as missing in spite of this evidence.

Pte.A.G.Lacey 3814 B.Coy. VIII Fltn. called in at our office to-day in answer to a letter we had sent him concerning above, whose number is next to his, but Pte.H.Lacey's belonged to A.Coy. These two men had evidently been confused by Pte.McGann. They are not related to each other. Pte.A.G.Lacey knows that Pte.H.Lacey was killed, his personal belongings were handed to a man of A.Coy. by Pte.H.Flick B.Coy. VIII Fltn. 29th Battn. to whom the informant advises us to write - as he can give us information of Pte.H. Lacey's death.

I was acting as clerk of the Battalion at the time. I handed them into the Battn. This was at Cheshire Camp. I did not know him by sight, he was in in A.Coy.

We have been making enquiries concerning -

3815 Pte. HARRY LACEY, 29th Battalion, A.I.F.

He is Missing 26/27-9-17, and during the course of our enquiries we wrote to 3814 Pte.A.G.Lacey, who could not give us much information concerning the above, but told us that you had seen his dead body, and could give us details of his death. We trust that you can give us some definite information, as so far we have not been able to learn much about him, though we regret very much to learn that he was killed. For the sake of the anxious enquirers we shall be very glad to hear from you as soon as possible and if it is true that Pte.H.Lacey was killed, can you tell us anything about his burial?
