

A Rededication Service for

Captain Eric Wilson Edwards

6th Battalion The Queen's (Royal West Surrey Regiment)

10.30 hours on Wednesday 15th May 2019 Gouzeaucourt New British Cemetery, France

Service conducted by The Reverend Ian Kemp CF, Chaplain 2nd Battalion The Princess of Wales's Royal Regiment Captain Eric Wilson Edwards was born on 1 June 1891 in Lee, Kent. He was the eldest of the two sons of William Edwards and Mary Wilson. He was educated at Blackheath Proprietary School and in November 1914 joined the Officer Training Corps at the University of London. He was a partner in the firm Braikenridge & Edwards Solicitors. In January 1916 he was Commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in The Queen's (Royal West Surrey Regiment). In April 1917 he was promoted to Lieutenant before becoming a Temporary Captain in October that year. In April 1916 he served in Ireland during the Easter Uprising.

On 30 November 1917, the day of his death, Captain Edwards was serving with 6th Battalion The Queen's (Royal West Surrey Regiment). The Battalion War Diaries show that on that day they were ordered to concentrate at Vaucelette Farm to consolidate a defensive position at Heudicourt, which the enemy had broken through. Upon reaching the farm, they dug in, but were unable to stop the advance. It was during this attack that Captain Edwards went missing. After the Great War, Captain Edwards was buried in Gouzeaucourt New British Cemetery as an unknown Captain. He was commemorated on the Cambrai Memorial. However, new research has enabled his grave to be identified. Today we will remember Captain Edwards and his grave will be rededicated.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Gouzeaucourt New British Cemetery, designed by Sir Herbert Baker, was begun in November 1917, taken over by the Germans in the spring of 1918, and used again by Commonwealth forces in September and October 1918. The original burials are now in Plot III. The cemetery was enlarged after the Armistice when graves, including the unidentified grave of Captain Eric Wilson Edwards, were brought in from other small cemeteries and the battlefield of Cambrai.

Captain Eric Wilson Edwards est né le 1 juin, 1891 à Lee, Kent. Il été le plus aine des deux fils de William Edwards et Mary Wilson. Il a fait ses études Blackheath Proprietary School et en novembre 1914 il est entré au 'Officer Training Corps' de l'Université de Londres. Il été un associé du cabinet d'avocats Braikenridge & Edwards Solicitors. En janvier 1916 il est devenu un officier commissionné dans le Queen's (Royal West Surrey Regiment). En avril 1917 il fut Lieutenant avant de devenir un Captain temporaire en octobre de la même année.

Le 30 novembre, 1917, le jour de son décès, Captain Edwards servait avec 6e Bataillon du Queen's (Royal West Surrey Regiment). Les Journaux de Guerre de 6e Bataillon indiquent que ce jour-là ils ont été ordonnés de concentrer à Vaucelette Farm et de consolider une position défensive que l'ennemie a traversé. En arrivant à la ferme, ils se retranché, mais ils ont été incapables d'arrêter l'avance. C'était au cours de cette attaque que Captain Edwards est disparu. Après la Grande Guerre il a été enterré à Gouzeaucourt New British Cemetery comme un Captain inconnu. Son nom est ainsi commémoré sur le monument commémoratif des disparus à Cambrai. Cependant, la nouvelle recherche a permis le site de son dernier repos d'être identifié. Aujourd'hui nous nous souviendrons de Captain Edwards et sa tombe sera consacrée une nouvelle fois.
