

"Missing - November 5th 1918."

"I was told by Corporal Worrall who was on leave from the Squadron that both Lieut. Baker and Lieut. Palliser were brought down in flames whilst flying over enemy territory - early in November 1918.

Enn Lieut. Palliser, with 8 others went over in new snipes from Amestaires, between Lille and Douai. Squadron 4 (in which I was) had had these new machines - first issue to any drcmes in Franco, and had great success. It is supposed the Huns got word of limited patrol. They were met by nearly 50 Fokkers who downed 5 out of the 9, amongst them was Lieut. Palliser, Lieut. Dymons, Rhodes and Granson. Captain King reported that Palliser had gone down badly. Four machines returned, but their formation had been split up and they came back at intervals. I cannot say what happened further.

On November 4th 1918 Lieut. PALLISER took part in a Squadron escort provided for the bombing machines of another Squadron. The bombs were successfully dropped on an enemy aerodrome near ATH (Belgium). On the return journey large numbers of enemy scouts were encountered, and from the ensuing dog-fight Lieut. PALLISER failed to return.

As no subsequent information has come to hand either from repatriated pilots or through enemy channels it seems certain that this pilot was shot down and killed.


