## Historical Background

The 56th Battalion was raised in Egypt on 14 February 1916 as part of the "doubling" of the AIF. Half of its recruits were Gallipoli vectorans from the 4th Battalion, and the other half, fireth reinfercements from Australia. Reflecting the composition of the 4th, the 56th was predominantly composed of men from New South Wales. The battalian became part of the 14th Brigade of the 5th Australian Division.

Arriving in France on 20 June 1916, the battalion entered the frontline trenches for the first time on 12 July and fought its first trayle battle was a disaster, resulting in heavy casualties across the devision. Despite these losses the 5th Division continued so man the front in the Frontline soctor for a further two months.

On 3 December 1916, it was noted that 14th Industry Brigade (incorporating 56th Bn ABY) that enemy artillery and enemy supers were fairly active and it was almost impossible to reach the front lines without effect. By dawn there was heavy selfing in the direction of Counderons.

Faith members of the 56th Bn were killed on 3 December 1916.
