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A Funeral Service for An Unknown Soldier of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, Killed in Action during the Great War

The remains of this unknown British soldier of the Great War were discovered by a farmer in Cuinchy. A cap badge found with the remains indicates that this was a soldier of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. Given the location of where the remains were found it is a possibility that this soldier was killed during the Battle of Loos in September 1915. However there are unfortunately still too many soldiers of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders missing from that battle to identify this soldier. He will therefore be buried today as an unknown soldier of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders.

Il sera donc inhumé comme un soldat inconnu d'Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders.
