Tyne Cot Cemetery, the largest Commonwealth War Graves Commission cemetery in the world, is now the resting place of more than 11,900 servicemen from the First World War. The Cross of Sacrifice stands on a German pillbox captured by the 3rd Australian Division on 4 October 1917. Used as an advanced dressing station, 343 graves were made on two sides of it by British and Canadian units from October 1917 to March 1918. After the Armistice remains were brought in from small burial grounds and the battlefields of Passchendaele and Langemarck. More than 8,370 of those buried here, including those being interred today, remain unidentified.
