Pozières British Cemetery

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Pozieres Birlist Cemetery was beguin in July 1916 and was used until March 1918 when Pozieres was lost to German forces. The original buriels carried out by fighting units and field ambulances in 1916, 1917 and 1918 form Pox II. The remaining plots were made after the Amisticox when graves were brought in from the surrounding battlefields. The four undertified casualities being buried here today were all recovered markly.
