informant states that they both belonged to "D" Company. On or about the 29th or 30th March 2018 the Battalion was in Hangard Wood to which place they had gone from Cashy. They were in action, the Germans pushing them back. It was the first day that they had been in action since confil from Belgium. About 5 p.s., Hail was hit by a builtet while he was in charge of a Machine Gun (Lawis) Socion. Informant did not see him hit but are him being taken but on a stratcher about 5 p.m. He was conscious and informant spake to him. Hail recognized Informant, who asked him her he felt. Informant did mot know where Hail was taken to but believed that he died in England.

According to Informant Hall was a very well liked chap.

I knew him well, he wame from N.S.W. He was taken away to the drossing station, and was fully conscious when leaving, but I do not know what became of him after that, and I cannot refer to anyone for details.

With further reference to your enquiry for your brother -1135 Cpl. A.B. HALL, 33rd Eattalion, A.T.F. We regret to inform you of two unofficial reports of his death, which we have received from men in the same unit but unfortunately they could not give us many details and no information as to his burial.

2876 Pte.J.McKenzie when interviewed at 3rd Southern General Houpital, Madeliffe Buildings, Oxford, stateā that he saw your brother wounded in the side by a bullet out in the open at Hangard Wood near 7illers Bretowneeux. He thinks thought the casualty work on Waster Sunday and he saw the stretcher bearers carry away your brother who was still alive then but unfortunately he heard nothing more about him - the Battalion advanced about 200 yards and the ground was held.

3254 Sgt. A.C. Johnston when interviewed at the Norfolk Var Hospital, Norvich, confirmed the above report and further stated that the onsualty which he described as a wound in the stomach - occurred whilst your brother was conveying a message from Capt. Shreeres the O.C. D.Coy, to Lt. Hoore of the same Company.

We are continuing our enquiries and will advise you at ence if any further reports reach us as we realise how anxious you must be.
