## Second Lieutenant Albert Hutchinson



Second Lieutenant Albert Hutchinson was born on 9 April 1898 in Hull, East Yorkshire. He was one of six children born to Charles Hutchinson and his wife Mary Elizabeth. On 19 November 1914, Albert enlisted into 4<sup>th</sup> Reserve Battalion The East Yorkshire Regiment at the ace of just 16.

On 30 July 1915, Albert transferred to B Company of 5° (Cyclist) Battalion The East Yoskine Regiment, a mobile coastal defence unit which carried out defence duties along the east coast of the United Kingdom throughout the First World War. By 6 October 1917, he had become an acting lance serjeant. On 8 November 1917 he was discharged to Commission and sent to the Officer Cadet Battalion at Balliot College. Oxford:

Second Leutenant Hutchinson arrived on the Western Front on 15 September 1918 and was posted to 2º Battalion on 15 September 1918 and was posted to 2º Battalion The Vick and Lancaster Regiment. On 8 October 1918, the battalion attacked from a position northeast of the village of Sequelant and was just in front of the Beaurevoir-Forsonme Line. They followed a creeing barrage and aimed to attack the village of Mericourt. The battalion formed up in the rear of 1° will be set to the second of the second o

Having come into the attack 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion The York and Lancaster Regiment were forced to halt and form a defensive flank. They could not advance towards Mericourt immediately owing to heavy machine gun fire. Later that day they were able to advance and obtained touch with the enemy in Mericourt. Second Lieutenant Hutchinson, by then aged 20, was killed during the folding that day.

After the war the remains of Second Lieutenant Hutchinson were concentrated into Busigny Communal Cemetery Extension and he was buried as an unknown second lieutenant of The York and Lancaster Regiment. As he was

missing. Second Lieutenant Hutchinson was commemorated on the Vise-n-Artios Memorial to the missing. However, new research has shown that this is in fact the grave of Second Lieutenant Hutchinson and the headstone over the grave has now been changed. Today we will remember Second Lieutenant Hutchinson and his grave will be rededicated.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Busigny Communal Cemetery Extension was first used in Cottober 1918 as the burial ground for several Casualty Clearing Stations. After the Armiticion, it was expanded when graves were brought in from smaller cemeteries and the battlefields between Cambrai and Guess. There are over 750 Commonwealth service personnel buried in the ceretelyr. Among them is either the Huchinson, who could not be identified at the limit of Huchinson.

Le 6 octobre, 1917, il est devenu lance sarjeant. Le 9 novembre, 1917, il dél biéré de farmée et envoyé au batallion des élèves Officiers du Balliol College, à Oxford.

Second Lieutenant Hutchinson est arrivé sur le front occidental le 15 septembre, 1918 et est affecté au 2º Bataillon du York and Lancaster Regiment. Le 8 octobre, 1918, le bataillon attaqua à partir d'une position située au nord-est du village de Sequehart, juste devant la ligne Beaurevoir-Fonsomme. Ils suivirent un barrage rampant et visérent à attaquer le village de Méricourt. Le bataillion se forme à l'arnière du 1º Bataillion du Buffs qui, à son tour, suit 1º Bataillon du King's Shropshire Lioht Infanty.

2º Bataillon du York and Lancaster Regiment, qui s'était porté à l'attaque, fut contraint de Sarrêter et de former un flanc défensif. Ils ne purent avancer vers Méricour limmédiatement en raison des tirs nourris de mitrailleuses. Plus tard dans la journée, ils purent avancer et entrérent en contact avec l'ennemi à Méricourt.
