

A Burial Service for an Unknown Soldier of The Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment) Killed during the Great War

11:00 hours Wednesday 17 April 2019 Guillemont Road Cemetery, France

Service conducted by the Reverend Tim Flowers CF Chaplain 4th Battalion The Mercian Regiment The remains of this Sherwood Forester were discovered on the outskirts of Ginchy during work on a wind turbine project. Research suggests that this soldier was most likely a member of 2nd Battalion The Sherwood Foresters who was killed in either September or October 1916 during heavy fighting in this area. However, there are unfortunately still too many soldiers of this battalion missing from that time period to identify this man. He will therefore be buried today as an unknown soldier of The Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment).

Les restes de ce soldat de Sherwood Foresters ont été découverts à l'orée de Ginchy au cours des travaux pour un projet d'éoliennes. Il est probablement qu'il été un soldat du 2º Bataillon Sherwood Foresters et qu'il a été tué en septembre ou octobre 1916 quand des combats violents eurent lieu dans cette region. Malheureusement il manque toujours un trop grand nombre de soldats des Connaught Rangers disparus pendant cette bataille pour pouvoir tenter d'identifier cet individu. Il serai donc inhumé aujourd'hui comme un soldat inconnu du Sherwood Foresters (Nottingham and Derbyshire Regiment).

Created by fighting units in September 1916, the Commonwealth War Graves Commission's Guillemont Road Cemetery was used as a burial ground until March 1917. After the Armistice, the cemetery was expanded with the concentration of graves from the surrounding battlefields. It is from this area that the unknown Sherwood Forester who is being interred today was recovered. He can now be laid to rest alongside other men from his regiment.
