"I knew Casualty. He was a stout built man, about 5 ft. 8 ins. medium complexion 30 years of age. Casualty was at Bridge Wood near Kemmel in the front line. He went out to link up with a party on our right with a Corporal. He had just about got there when an H.A. shell landed near him a piece hitting his in the body killing him instantly. I was about 200 yds. away at the time of his death. We were relieved soon after and he was left on the field to be buried by the relieving party."

Killed in Action 26/4/18

"I knew casualty. He was a stout built man about 5'7" fair complexion, about 30 years of age. Casualty was with the Battalion when in the front line at Verostrit near Spree. He volunteered to go in a patrol to No Man's Land to seek information and while going out he was shot in the abdomen by a machine gun bullet which killed him instantly. I did not see him killed but Sgt. L. H. Murray from Farracknaboul was the only one who saw him. I do not know where he was buried."

KILLED 26-4-18*

About this date at Vearstraat(?) near Lt. Kersl. He was out on patrol with two other men at the time of enemy's push. The other two men Cpl. Murray and Pte. Johnstone of 22nd Corps L.H. said they got too near enemy line, half a dozen Machine Guns opened up and Grayson fell - killed outright shot through heart. They were all on foot, the other two men Murray & Johnstone got back, as they were almost surrounded and Grayson was left where he fell. His body was not recovered as far as we know.

Grayson was a stiff jovial man of medium height, keen on sport, hair turning grey, age about 33. On April 26 we were in front of Dickens' bush on the left of Kemmel Hill in the Ridge Wood Sector. The enemy shell fire was very heavy, one shell dropped close to Grayson and killed him instantly. He was not badly damaged. A Scottish unit buried him where he fell. I saw this being about 200 yards away at the time.

Grayson was shot through the stomach in front of Hill 60, near Shrewsbury Forest. He was out on patrol with Sgt. Murray at the time, but it was impossible to get the body in so it had to be left where it lay.

Grayson was a very fine fellow indeed; always ready for anything, and held in the highest esteem by all of us.
