A Rededication Service for Serjeant John MacKenzie MM

Serjeant John MacKenzie MM was born on 26 April 1896 and was just 21 years old when he died on 25th March 1918, a few days after the start of the German Spring Offensive. Having been wounded he was taken prisoner and died of his wounds in Inchy-en-Artois. Serjeant MacKenzie was described as a 'singularly brave and intrepid soldier', receiving the Military Medal twice as well as the Croix de Guerre. Until recently the location of Serjeant MacKenzie's grave remained unknown and he is commemorated on the Arras Memorial. However new research has shown that he is in fact buried in Anneux British Cemetery. During this service we will remember Serjeant MacKenzie and rededicate his grave. We will also remember his brothers Private Kenneth MacKenzie of the Cameron Highlanders and Lance Corporal Donald MacKenzie of the Cameron Highlanders who were both killed during the Great War and who still have no known grave.
